It has been another busy year for the Kawartha Trans Canada Trail Association! Listed below are just some of our 2016 highlights:

- Won the Marketing Excellence Award for our Love Your Trail campaign from the Lindsay & District Chamber of Commerce.
- 2. Raised funds through Knights of Columbus (\$425) and Kawartha Runs (\$2,000).
- 3. Received a grant from the Eastern Ontario Development Program (EODP) to implement our fundraising strategy.
- 4. Appointed two new directors (welcome Kathy Simpson and Mike McLean).
- 5. Signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with Fleming College regarding trail use.
- Established a partnership with the City of Kawartha Lakes for the development of Logie/ Lilac Park.
- 7. Completed filming for a four-season KTCT video.
- 8. Began implementation of special **Five.Five.** sponsor program.
- 9. Updated website (<u>www.ktct.ca</u>).
- 10. Assisted Scott Young Public School with Trail-a-thon.
- 11. Participated in the Community Service Credit Program with two I.E. Weldon students.

Who Uses the KTCT? Survey Says...

The Trail Studies Unit at Trent University completed a trail user survey for the KTCT. The survey found that the largest group (44%) of trail users were visitors from Peterborough County, followed by residents in Kawartha Lakes (27%).

The respondents knew about the trail mainly from general knowledge from living in the area or by word of mouth, the Internet and signage. The trail is used by all ages with almost half being between 45 and 64. The survey would not have been possible without the financial support of the Ontario Ministry of Tourism, Culture and Sports for providing funding under the Summer Experience Program (SEP) for students, and the volunteers from the Kawartha Trans Canada Trail Association for supervision of the work done.






