

Here is a list of accomplishments for 2015:

- Held, a very successful first annual Trail-a-thon in May with many volunteers and over 100 students from Mariposa Public School.




Mowing Matters

Fewer, Bigger, Longer Fundraising Strategy

With the completion of the Kawartha Trans Canada Trail, comes the challenge of managing annual operating costs for trail maintenance and awareness programs. Our trail is the only major trail in Kawartha Lakes that is not funded by the municipality. For that reason and reduced grant opportunities, we commissioned **jacks communications** of Lindsay to develop a fundraising strategy.



Jacks prepared a multi-faceted strategy titled "Fewer, Bigger, Longer," which identified several new tactics to help our fundraising efforts.

Fundraising Goal Our hard target is \$84,000 over the next five years, while our soft target is \$125,000. The latter would ensure basic operating costs could be covered for the next seven years—from 2016 through 2022. A minimum of \$12,000 each year is

required from all sources (although \$15,000 is preferable to allow for modest inflation and unforeseen added operational expenses).

The cornerstone of the strategy centres on the premise that we need to attract support from four key groups: businesses, service clubs, user groups, and individuals. Businesses and service clubs are currently being approached one-on-one, while an outreach letter has been sent to select service clubs. We anticipate positive outcomes from both those efforts. A package will be developed for a specific group of individuals, but it is currently in the research stage. It will focus on individuals interested in legacy support. Collectively, these sponsors will be referred to as "Five. Five. Five." supporters to reflect their expected five year support, (i.e., five key sponsors from each group, each contributing \$1,000 for five consecutive years commencing anytime starting after this year). Early indications are encouraging.

We will continue to ask for contributions from other individuals on a donate-what-you-can basis. Reaching user groups presents a greater challenge since most are not organized or are difficult to reach. Methodologies to reach them will be part of our future planning discussions.

Love Your Trail Campaign The first year of the strategy hinges on a successful one-year fundraising campaign to set-up future success. A campaign titled "Love Your Trail" was created to nurture existing relationships and to attract new interest. Board Member, John Hagarty, who also is Chief of the Kawartha Lakes Police Service, is chairing the campaign. More information will be released over the course of the next 12 months. 





