

oube's Trestle Bridge is a local historical bridge that passes over the Buttermilk Valley, which is roughly situated east of Omemee and west of Peterborough. Originally constructed in the 1880s for the Midland Railway, it stretches 175 metres long and 4.15 metres wide and stands just over 21 metres high. It is one of Ontario's great remaining railway attractions and is promoted by the City of Kawartha Lakes as part of the Arts and Heritage Trail. The bridge offers trail users, residents and visitors alike, beautiful vistas of natural features and drumlins in the Buttermilk Valley. In order to ensure the safety and longevity of this historical gem, the rotten wooden decking needed to be replaced with sustainable, long-lasting composite lumber.





Thanks to the National Trans Canada Trail office, private donations, our 5-5-5 supporters and specific federal grant programs, the \$140,000 re-decking project was completed this fall by McColl Construction.

Please note there is no municipal funding provided for this bridge project—all funds had to come from other sources.

Geocaching...The World's Largest Treasure Hunt



From October 2018 to November 2019, KTCT's Eco-counter recorded 20,988 trail users: 13,013 pedestrians and 7,985 cyclists.

In addition to counting and differentiating between pedestrians and cyclists, the counter measures the direction of travel, works in all weather conditions, transmits the data to software seamlessly, and has a two-year battery life.


